#439-#543	-----	Brownfields Redevelopment	A package of amendments that recapitalize the Brownfields Redevelopment Fund and extend the tax credit

#906	0611-5510	Payment in Lieu of Taxes	Increases funding to \$25.3 million

#1111	7100-0350	Toxics Use Reduction Institute	\$250,000 for a demonstration project for viability of using safer alternatives for 5 toxic chemicals
#912	2310-xxxx	Natural Heritage and Endangered Species	Reinstates the line item funded at \$300,000
#1108	-----	Natural Heritage and Endangered Species	Makes permanent the administrative fee waiver
#551	2310-0300	Wildlife Management	Provides \$800,000 as the necessary match for Federal funding
#1105	-----	Environmental Bond	Increases funding for various programs
#1468	2810-0200	DCR Summer Employment	Provides \$3 million for summer jobs for peer-led programs or individuals in economic development areas
